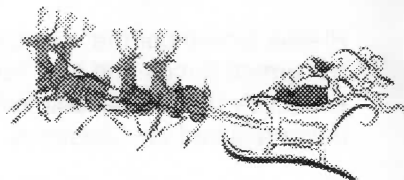

## LETTER FROM OUR MINISTER, THE REV'D HUGH CADE.

*Dear friends,*

It may come as no surprise to you to hear that my diary is virtually free of church business meetings in December! "It's too busy a month – let's leave it until the New Year," has been the cry when the date of the next meeting came up on the agenda. It is a month that's full of preparation and people, of purchasing and parties, a month to be enjoyed, not least as an antidote to the darkness and shortness of winter days.



But, paradoxically, it's also Advent; a time for not being busy, a time to think about all the coming of God to us means, a time to open our lives again to receive him. This kind of preparation is often best done during quiet times, perhaps part of daily routine, or at times set aside to make lists of all the things to be done in the month. Using the bible, by reflecting quietly on the readings that are used in worship in Advent or re-reading slowly and attentively the Christmas stories, are ways of allowing God to speak to us the words he wants us to hear this Christmas.

But at a time when we prepare to celebrate Jesus' coming to share our ordinary lives, there may also be ways of making our apparently purely secular tasks into the means of spiritual activity. Thinking about the right present for someone, for example, reflects God's individual attention to each of us; the shopping and preparation that goes into a meal or social gathering is an image of God's careful provision for those he loves. Spending time with people we love can be a reminder that God enjoys spending time with us and being part of our lives. Writing cards and sharing news mirrors God's longing to communicate with us, something which God achieves outstandingly in Jesus.

As we try to maintain an appropriate balance in these coming weeks between busyness and quietness, it can help to find ways like these of reflecting, whilst in the middle of some routine job, on an aspect of our understanding of God. In that way we bring our Advent preparation into the middle of our daily lives, just as Christ's birth brought him straight into the turmoil of human experience.

With every blessing this Christmastide and in the New Year and with love, joy and peace,

## Joan Rishworth – 1918-2007

We will all have been saddened to hear, at the end of October, of the sudden death of Joan Rishworth. Every community appreciates its characters, and those who contribute to its everyday life. Joan was such a person.

Together with her husband, Don, Joan moved to Broadwell in 1964 and later became known to most of us when she took over the running of the village Post Office, a job from which she retired when in her early eighties.

At ease living in the present times, whilst always enjoying reminiscing of earlier days, Joan thoroughly enjoyed discussing with her friends and family a wide range of subjects, especially the state of the country, the world, the weather, her garden (and those of others) and, not least, the *Daily Telegraph*, which each day she always read from cover to cover.

Music played a major part in Joan's life and you would never call at her home and not hear music playing in the background.

To many people, Joan was a special person. Her family, her friends and Broadwell will always remember her and miss her.

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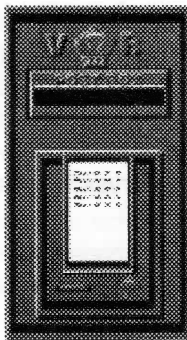
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## Christmas post box:

## Christmas Day service:

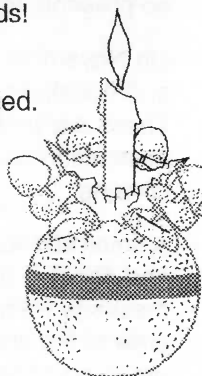

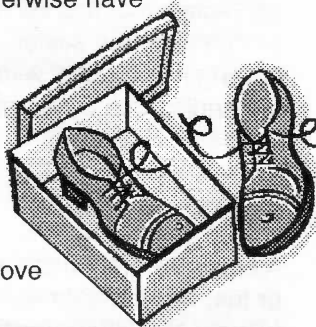


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## Operation Christmas Child Shoe Box Appeal:

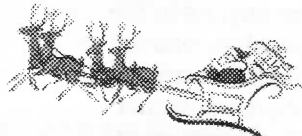
## Victory Hall:

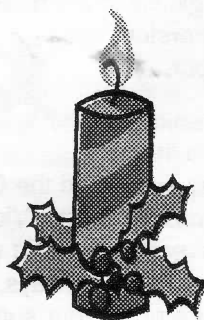

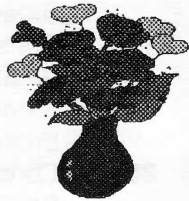

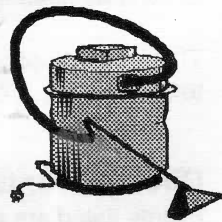
