

And, of course, to thrive means much more than just to be seen to be successful; and is far much more than being financially secure.

Psalm 92: 12-13 says: 'The righteous thrive like a palm tree and grow like a a cedar tree in Lebanon. Planted in the house of the Lord, they thrive in the courts of our God.'

The contemporary worship band, Casting Crowns, sings the following lyrics:

We know we were made for so much more than ordinary lives It's time for us to more than just survive we were made to thrive

I like that line: It's time for us to more than just survive, we were made to thrive. I wonder what that line evokes in you as we realise we are almost in the middle of this year already. It is with great sadness that we report the death in hospital of Sue Middleton after a very short illness. Our sincere condolences to Sue's family and friends.

Just 10 days before she died, Sue was merrily mowing her lawn! She saw age as no barrier to an active life!

During her 49 years in Leamington Hastings, Sue was a tireless worker for the Parish Church with bell-ringing, church flowers, church cleaning (both inside and out!) as well as organising the floral display cart and village parties and events.

She was an accomplished equestrian and took a keen interest in country pursuits. More recently she was an active member of LH Silver Surfers despite finding computers and the Internet frequently frustrating! Sue belonged to the Frankton pilates group and attended sessions every week.
